Isabela dreamed of new income and to source food directly from their own communities

Farmers monocrop rice, corn, and tobacco, and wanted new and consistent source of income.

Vegetables come from afar (Baguio, Nueva Vizcaya) making nourishing food expensive and inaccessible.


Half of the municipalities had 2x the malnutrition rate than national average

Isabela set out (and achieved!) their dreams of securing food, health, and income





Together, we reached 2,507 families (65% of pop) across 6 communities from Roxas and Reina Mercedes





Capturing those most in need: those who joined Feed Back were below the poverty threshold



1,856 families or 74% of those who got seeds joined the exchanges

Families who joined the exchange accessed more vegetables and created diversity.

They get to experience fun firsthand, share and bond with their ka-barangays, and build weekly routines that lead to healthier habits like planting, sharing planting techniques, and eating more vegetables.

Families brought home 6.1 kg of nourishing food every week, reclaiming food security



Feed Back enables a family of four to eat 3 nourishing meals for 4.5 days! Aside from additional meals, the nutritional value and richness grows as well.





Through Feed Back, Isabela catalyzed a brand new local food supply by producing an *EXCESS* of 51,671 kg of organic fruits and vegetables in 15 weeks









Families can now cook Dinengdeng and Pinakbet sourced from their own backyard gardens

From chemical to organic farming made possible through Feed Back

Isabela farmers are used to commercial and chemical farming.

With Feed Back Plus, not only did they see the importance of organic farming and feeding their families safe produce but they learned that it's possible to create their own organic inputs.

47 families learned how create their own organic compost. Alma Pascua of Simimbaan sold **6 sacks** (50kg/sack) of bokashi for P2,100.






Feed Back Plus captured 7 out of every 10 at-risk families

In Isabela, at-risk families are those whose monthly income fall below the poverty threshold of P14,737

The program occurred during El Nino drought and protected the families against hunger and malnutrition.

Cutog Grande and Labinab Grande reached 94% and 93% of at-risk families.





Isabela is first to pilot the Feed Back Plus market connection

The Plus or Market Phase is 7 weeks of market development so that families can become ARKpreneurs who will have new source of consistent income

Due to challenges in change of leadership post-elections, which happened right as the program transitioned, Mallalatang Tungui did not proceed with Plus.

Creating a path for 157 ARKpreneurs

Around <mark>8%</mark> of families signed up as ARKpreneurs. Among the sign-ups, 40% remained active suppliers.



Nanay Corazon was one of the first to raise her hand to become an ARKpreneur.


She earned **P1,859** from selling **43 kg of kalabasa**, and never missed a delivery! She went from peddling her veggies to being a consistent supplier.



This allows communities to sell diverse, fast-growing vegetables, creating year-round income vs monocrops








Transformation of Labinab Grande



Labinab Grande had to overcome environmental hindrances



Labinab Grande is a small community consisting of monocroppers and working professionals.

Already disadvantaged by its landlocked nature and rocky soil, Labinab was further challenged by limited backyard space and the droughts and typhoons brought on by El Nino





Feed Back introduced possibility and innovation

Through Feed Back, families started planting more vegetables in their backyards – across 40 varieties, including upo, kangkong, and eggplant.

They learned to be **resourceful and creative**, planting in sacks and containers.

The municipality rallied for a **second round of seedling distribution**, giving hope to families heavily affected by drought

They were inspired by other vegetable producing barangays. They wanted to show that they can do it too and they did!

Labinab Grande leaped from 21% to 81% participation and finished strong

The council's recommitment and leadership re-ignited the families' commitment to join the Exchanges

They experienced a dip mid-exchange because of fear of disqualification among running council members and environmental challenges

They came back stronger and really made Exchange a barangay celebration of their productivity and unity







Senior citizens are socially healthier and more physically active during Exchange

Actively participating senior citizens represented 39% of the participants -- they loved to dance and play games that brought them back to their childhood

After Feed Back Plus, Labinab Grande families are now consistent and committed producers

Labinab has 20 active ARKpreneurs (32% of total active suppliers) - the most number of ARKpreneurs across 5 barangays.


Families now earn additional income from produce harvested from their backyard gardens.

In 5 deliveries, each Labinab Grande ARKpreneur earned an average of **P259** every week.





Kapitan Dodoy saw his barangay transform and now leads by example
